

Eastside City Park- Aerial view

Location: Birmingham

This is first new park to be inserted into the dense urban grain of the city of Birmingham for 130 years. It was built on a brown field site and is the focal point of the Eastside regeneration area.

The park has a strong structure, organised around a simple and striking wide path that runs 370 meters east to west linking two lawns and lined with pergolas. The most significant public space is the gently terraced City Park Square, which is animated with elegant water fountains and large sculptural lighting features.

A 190 x 3m linear water feature on the northern edge of the park is lined by timber slatted benches below scots pine trees and is a calm oasis that transforms into a busy paddling pool on sunny days.
